Annual Written Report to Parents

The children's annual written reports will be sent out on Friday 15th July, along with their SAT results.

Parents of pupils in Reception will receive a detailed written report, explaining the Early Years Foundation Stage, how their children have been assessed and the progress they have made during their first year in school.

Pupils in Years 1 - 6 follow the National Curriculum, which has been completely revised. This academic year saw the introduction of the new National Curriculum across the whole age range, where assessment levels are no longer used. Instead pupils are now assessed according to whether or not they have met national age-related expectations. The government's expectation is that children will have a secure understanding of 100% of the Programmes of Study for their Year Group; there is no longer the possibility of using a 'best fit' judgement, as was the case previously. Consensus amongst education professionals is that this is very harsh requirement and although I agree with high expectations and aspirational targets, I believe this is going to be difficult for a number of our pupils, especially if they have special educational needs. In the pupils' annual reports this year, we have decided to leave most of the report unchanged, apart from the addition of a section reporting on the level of understanding that has been reached in reading, writing and maths. This will be recorded as a percentage of how much of the Programmes of Study, a pupil has secured. In Key Stage 2, the English Programmes of Study span a two year period, whereas in Maths, each Year Group has its own syllabus.

Class 3 and 4 pupils have already read their reports through and discussed them with their teachers. Younger pupils have not seen their reports yet as we leave it up to parents to share the contents with them as appropriate. When you receive the pupils' reports, please would you sign the attached slip, adding any comment you might wish to make in the space provided. The slip must then be returned to school in order that we can check you have received your child's report. Parents' comments will then be attached to the pupils' reports and kept on file. Or you may simply return the original report signed (with or without a comment) for us to copy for our records and we will send the report back to you to keep. Please note the grade on page 2 of the report relates to effort not attainment. If you wish to discuss anything on the report, please make an appointment to see me or your child's class teacher.

I am sure you will join me in thanking the teachers for all the huge amount of thought and effort that has gone into writing these reports; they are immensely detailed and I hope you find them helpful. Most of the reports are very encouraging and the vast majority of our pupils are to be congratulated on another excellent year of work and progress, which is a lovely way to end the year.
