
# Year 1 Phonics Screening

#### What is the challenge?

- Every Year 1 child in the country will take a phonics screening check in June, this year.
- The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.
- The focus of the check is to provide evidence of children's decoding and blending skills, not to test their vocabulary.

#### What is Phonics?


- Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word.
- ► There are around 40 different sounds.
- Children have a 20 minutes discrete phonics lessons each day which consolidates and extends work begun in the Foundation Stage.



# What happens during the phonics check?

- The check takes approximately 4 to 9 minutes to complete.
- Children will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together. e.g. d-o-g - dog.
- The check will consist of 40 words and non-words.
- Children will be told if the word is a real or 'alien' word, with a corresponding alien image.

#### How will it be administered?

- ► I will conduct all of the screening checks with the children.
- The children will complete the check, one to one , in a quiet area of the school.
- We are not permitted to indicate to the children at the time whether they have correctly sounded out and/or blended the word.

### When will it happen?

- The screening will take place throughout the week beginning Monday 13th June.
- It has been designed so that children of all abilities will be able to take part.

#### The results

- The school will inform you of whether your child falls below OR has met the national standard. (The threshold being determined by DfE).
- Results will be reported home in July.
- If your child does fall below the expected standard, they will re-take the phonics screening check in Year 2.

### How can you help?

Encourage your child to 'sound out' when reading or writing. Focusing particularly on spotting more unusual sound patterns.

Digraph- 2 letters making one sound COW Trigraphs- 3 letters making one sound night Split digraphs- 2 vowels with a consonant in between spine - i\_e Alternative sounds- the various ways of making a sound e.g. ai- a-e,a, ay, eigh & ey

#### How can you help?

Revisit some of the phonics sheets that have been sent home. Children can practise their phonics by playing games online. The children particularly like:

- Buried Treasure
- Poopdeck Pirates
- Picnic on Pluto

Please make sure that they practise a mixture of real and alien words.



### How can you help?

REMEMBER: Phonics is not the only way you become a good reader. Continue to read with your child each night and encourage them to:

- Sound out, re-read to check it makes sense, and use pictures for clues.
- Ask questions about the book.
- And most importantly ENJOY READING!
