Admissions Arrangements

- ▶ Bledlow Ridge School is a local authority maintained primary school for children living in Bledlow Ridge, Saunderton and Saunderton Lee
- ▶ The school typically admits 24 children into Reception and KS1 and up to 27 in KS2.
- ▶ If there are more applications than spaces available, parents will need to go to appeal to get a school place.
- ▶ All admissions are handled by the Admissions Team, County Hall, Aylesbury.
- ▶ A school bus, organised by Wycombe Area Education Office is available for pupils who are within the catchment area but living some distance from school.

Community

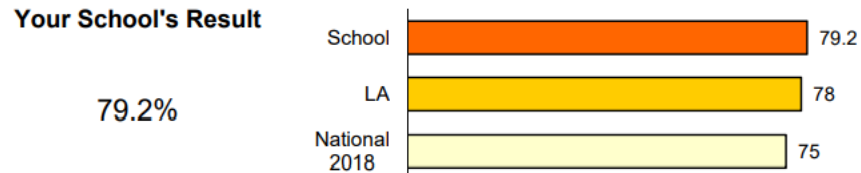
- ▶ Our school is part of a small, caring community and we are proud of the strong links we have with the local area.

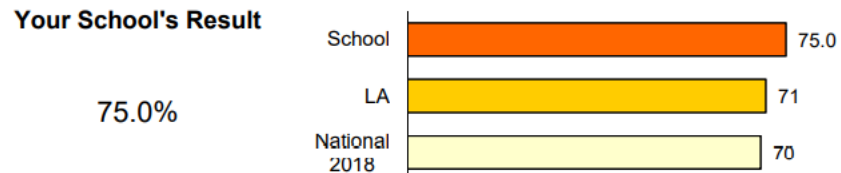
- ▶ At the end of KS1 outcomes are above or inline with national

Percentage of pupils achieving at least the Expected standard in Reading



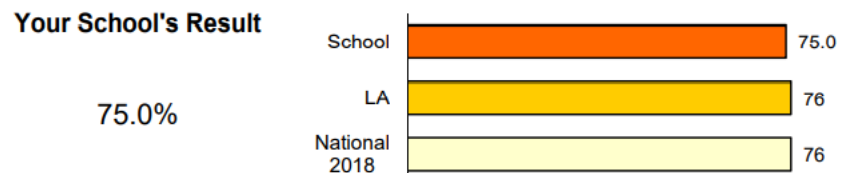
LA Top 20% of schools are equal to or above 86.7 LA Bottom 20% of schools are below

Percentage of pupils achieving at least the Expected standard in Writing



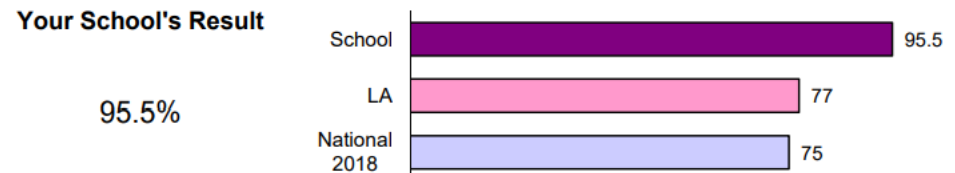
LA Top 20% of schools are equal to or above 81.7 LA Bottom 20% of schools are below

Percentage of pupils achieving at least the Expected standard in Maths



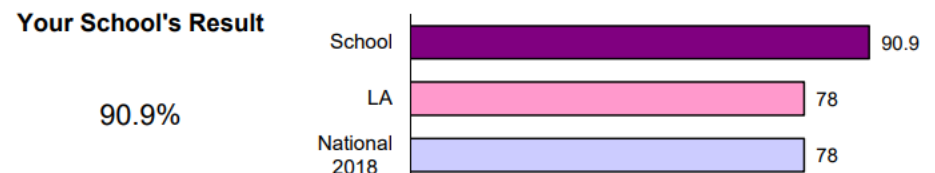
LA Top 20% of schools are equal to or above 85.5 LA Bottom 20% of schools are below

Percentage of pupils achieving at least the Expected standard in Reading



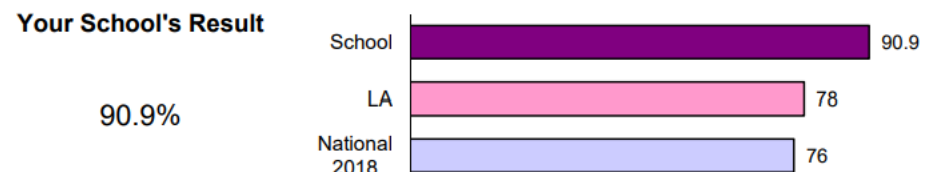
LA Top 20% of schools are equal to or above 88.3 LA Bottom 20% of schools are below
