

Reception Class Learning Blog – Summer Term – Week 9

Friday 23rd June 2023

The children have worked extremely hard this week. It has been a particularly challenging week for us in Reception, as we have had a taster of working in a more structured way through a learning carousel. We were very impressed in how the children approached their learning and how conscientious they were in finishing their activities, particularly as they were working on a much more independent level.

During T4W this week, we started our new focus book, Dear Zoo. The children identified the characters and labelled them during their learning activities. We identified the repeated phrases, “So, they sent me a...” and “I sent him back..” and used these to retell the story accurately following a story map. We revisited our knowledge of adjectives and identified these in the story. During our learning carousel, we began our guided reading tasks, where we focused on developing our comprehension skills, by answering questions about what we have read. We will continue to practise this in the coming weeks and invite you to also support the children in this venture by working through the ‘After Reading’ page at the back of the Little Wandle reading books.

During Maths this week, we have been learning about doubling numbers. We identified that a double number means that the same number is used again. We discussed that when a number is doubled, it becomes twice as big, enabling us to recap our addition knowledge and vocabulary. This week, we learnt to use the words: total and altogether. We continued to practise our addition sentence reading skills and used our number formation knowledge to complete written calculations.

Our UW and EAD focus has been centred around wild animals and the zoo. This week, we studied a map of Whipnade Zoo and identified the meanings of the symbols. We learnt that the legend helps us to understand the symbols on the map. We worked independently using a grapheme mat, to write a list of the animals that we would all like to see at the Zoo this Friday when we visit.

We have also been collecting resources for our new role play area. Over the next few weeks, we will be developing a Safari jeep, where we will be able to go out and spot our favourite wild animals. Of course, we wouldn't be able to do this without a pair of state of the art binoculars. We busied ourselves this week with making our own box construction binoculars. To make sure that we were camouflaged, we decorated them with animal print paper.
